


Summer 2020 - Frequently asked questions for candidates receiving results for A-level, Level 3 BTECS and other Level 3 qualifications.

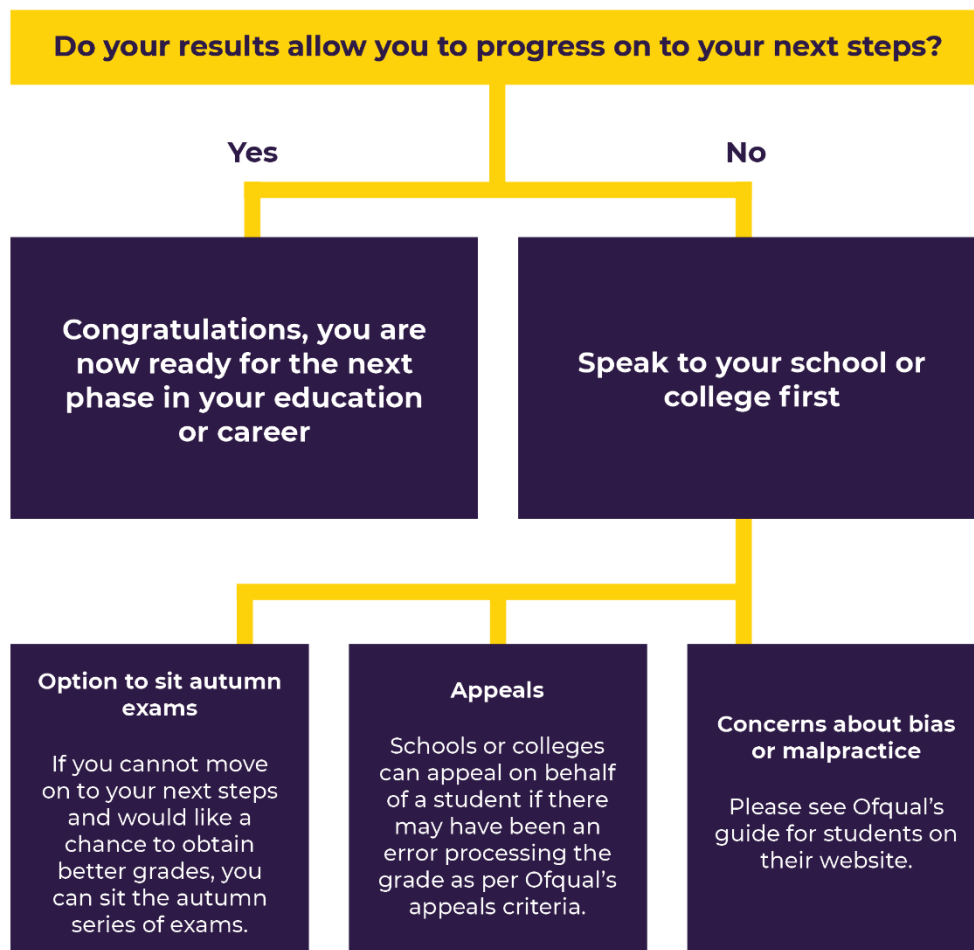
Q: What are my options now I have my results?

Q: I would like to sit exams in the Autumn for one or more subjects; how do I go about this?

A: Fill out this form [here](#) and you will be contacted with further information. If you do resit, the higher of the Summer or Autumn 2020 grade can be taken forward. Fees may be payable (tbc) and entry deadlines for A-levels are very tight. Our deadline is **Tuesday 18th August** to register your interest so please do not delay if you think you may wish to sit an exam in October 2020.

Q: I would like to know more about how FSG produced my centre assessed grade; how do I go about this?

A: Fill out the form [here](#). You will need to complete a form for each subject and explain why you require this information. Requests will be processed within 30 days of receipt. Ensure you let us know, when completing the form, if you wish to appeal or have a university place at risk so this can be prioritised.

Q: I would like to appeal a grade; how do I go about this?

A: In the first instance please read the student guide [here](#) and if you still believe there is reason to appeal, book a video call appointment with a member of SLT to discuss your concerns. Mr Buckley has sent out an email with instructions how to book a call.

Q: None of the above scenarios apply but I would like to speak to someone but as I cannot come into school how do I do this?

Members of SLT will be available on Thursday and Friday after results day. Please refer to the email sent to you by Mr Buckley with instructions how to book a video call.

Appointments will be prioritised for those who have places at university at risk or where there may be grounds for an appeal.
